Enclosed is one copy of Hiawatha Telephone Company's (Hiawatha) Tariff M.P.S.C. No. 1(R) revisions for filing with the Commission pursuant to Public Act 179 of 1991, as amended, MCL 484.2101 et seq.

This filing is the result of the consolidation of Chippewa County Telephone Company into Hiawatha Telephone Company, with the latter as the surviving legal entity. The tariff changes reflect the addition of the Brimley Exchange to the Exchanges, related exchange rates and local calling areas already set forth in the Hiawatha tariffs.

This tariff filing also reflects (1) the availability of additional "Safety+net Bundled Phone and Internet Offerings," (2) the increase in service charges for all exchanges except the Brimley exchange, and (3) the availability of the "Tribal Link Up Program" in the Brimley exchange only.

A. GENERAL

- 1. The provision of service at the rates shown below is subject to the regulations given in the General Rules and Regulations as they now exist and are filed with and form part of this Tariff.
- 2. The rates shown below (except for Semi-Public Service) entitle the customer to calls to all stations bearing the designation of a central office of the following exchanges, which comprise the Local Service Area:

Zone 1 BRIMLEY

- Zone 2 All rate centers within the geographic boundaries of the 906 Area Code as of October 1, 2005 besides those included in Zone 1
- 3. The Company will Block 1-Pius Dialed Calls to Stations within the Local Service Area (except 8YY calls)
- 4. Calls made to a telephone number with an NPA NXX that is associated with the rate center that is within the customer's local calling area are local calls regardless of the physical location of the called party.

Basic local exchange services installed after June 30, 2001 will include touchcall service at no additional charge above the rates listed for the class of service installed. Residence PBX trunks, Key or One Party lines in service at July 1, 2001, that did not have touchcall service as an auxiliary service at the end of business June 30, 2001 will receive a monthly credit of \$1.50 during the period that line is in continual service. Business PBX trunks, Key or One Party lines in service at July 1, 2001, that did not have touchcall service is not affirmatively added as an auxiliary service. Business PBX trunks, Key or One Party lines in service at July 1, 2001, that did not have touchcall service as an auxiliary service at the end of business June 30, 2001 will receive a monthly credit of \$2.00 during the period that line is in continual service after June 30, 2001 and touchcall service is not affirmatively added as an auxiliary service. C. EXCHANGE SERVICE AREA - Which is that area described as follows:

Exchange: Brimley

The Company will measure Conversation MOU from the time when the Company's switching equipment receives answer supervision to the earlier of when the Company's switch receives disconnection supervision from the Company's switch or from the terminating switch.

The Company will round measure Conversation MOU to the next higher whole MOU per call.

The Company will not bill the end user for non-conversation time related to local calls.

Conversation MOU do not include 0-plus or 0-minus calls.

The Company will not provide call record detail for local usage. No MOU

are carried forward from month to month.



LOCAL TELEPHONE EXCHANGE SERVICE

SERVICE CHARGES

A. GENERAL

- 1. Service charges are applicable with the establishment of the telephone service, and for subsequent changes and additions thereto as specified in this tariff.
- 2. Service charges consisting of one or more of the following charges may apply for new or additional service or changes in service which require the activity or work as briefly indicating under "Charges" or as specified under Application of Charges or as modified by specific Tariff items elsewhere in this tariff.
- **B. APPLICATION OF CHARGES**
 - Establishment of Service An establishment of service charge applies on each customer order when a new customer account is established. A customer order involving an existing account (made subsequent to establishment of the account) also has an establishment of service charge as shown under "Charges". The Establishment of Service Charge to existing accounts applies when an existing customer's order involves lines, outside plant, or other requested services for which monthly rates are established.

The Establishment of Service Charge also applies to:

Establishment of a special billing number account at the customer's request. Change to nonpublished number service.

The Establishment of Service Charges does not apply to:

Change in grade of service. Change in billing address Discontinuance of nonpublished number service Discontinuance of any service if changes in equipment are not required. Change in classification of service (bus. or res.)

2. Line Connection Charge - A line connection charge, per line, is made for each line on which work is required by the service order; in the central office; outside plant; drop wire; or other portion of plant up to the premises served.

This charge also applies to a change in telephone number or party line assignment made at the request of the customer, restoral of service, establishment to touch calling service or move of drop wire.

- 4. Other Applications or Exceptions To Service Charges
 - a. The charges specified herein do not contemplate work being performed by the company employees at a time when overtime wages apply due to the request of the customer nor do they contemplate work begun being interrupted by the customer. If the customer requests overtime labor being performed or interrupts work once begun, a charge in addition to the specified charges will be made equal to the additional cost involved.
 - b. No service charge will apply when the service is rendered inoperative by fire or other cause beyond the control of the customer which renders the premises unfit for occupancy and service is re-established at another location. Service charges apply for transferring a temporary installation to another location.

C. MONTHLY RATES AND DISCOUNTS FOR LIFELINE CUSTOMERS

1. The discount on the monthly rate for residential exchange service for qualified Lifeline customers shall be \$9.25 from the Federal discount program plus \$2.00 from the State discount program for a total discount of \$11.25. Credits are applied to the end user's basic local exchange service. At no time shall the total Lifeline credit exceed the sum of the end user common line charge and the basic local exchange rate. The discount on the monthly rate for residential exchange service for qualified Lifeline customers 65 years of age or more shall be \$9.25 from the Federal discount program plus \$3.10 from the State discount program for a total discount of \$12.35. Credits are applied to the end user's basic local exchange service. At no time shall the total Lifeline credit exceed the sum of the end-user common line charge and the basic local exchange rate.

D. MONTHLY RATE FOR NON LIFELINE CUSTOMERS

A rate specified in MECA's Tariff M.P.S.C.No. 25 Part XVII, General applies per exchange access line to cover the costs of the Lifeline service, to the Telephone Company intrastate services as listed below:

- Business and Residence exchange services excluding Lifeline customers.
- PBX Trunk Services
- Centrex Services

The rate for business Centrex station lines will be computed based on the trunk Equivalence Table specified in the Company's Tariff M.P.S.C. No. 2.

- E. TRIBAL LINK UP PROGRAM Brimley Exchange Only
- 1. A discount on the line connection charge is available to qualifying Lifeline customers residing on Tribal lands as defined in 47CFR §54.400(e) for the installation or transfer of services from one residential premises to another.
- a. A qualifying customer may receive a 100% reduction up to \$100 in the installation charges, or transfer of service charges, for connection at the customer's principal place of residence.
 - A qualifying customer may then make payments for the connection charges on a deferred schedule in which the qualifying customer does not pay interest. The interest charges not charged to the qualifying customer shall be for connection charges of up to \$200.00 that are deferred for a period not to exceed one year. Charges assessed for installation or transfer of service include any charges that the Company customarily assesses to connect subscribers to the network. These charges do not include any permissible security deposit requirements.
 - c. A qualifying customer can receive the benefits of the Tribal Link Up Program for a second and subsequent time only for a principal place of residence with an address different from the residential address at which the Tribal Link Up assistance was approved previously.
